# **General Pull Information**

**Location:** Oakey Park, Osceola, WI **Date:** Saturday, September 6, 2025

Pull start time: 10:00 am

Admission: Adults: \$10, 11-17 year olds: \$5, 10 years and under: Free, Pullers: Free Registration: \$25 each class (Includes a free lunch at the Osceola FFA concession stand)

Puller registration starts: 8:30 am

### **Definitions**

Track officials: Sled operator, FFA Advisor, FFA Alumni committee member, track crew member

Class Category: Out of the field, Altered Farm, Improved, or Open

Class: Weight classes under the class category

**OEM:** Original Equipment Manufacturer **DQ:** Disqualification- forfeit registration fee


# **Entry Rules**

Minimum age to pull is 12 years

- All participants need to sign a waver- drivers aged 12-17 must have a guardian's signature
- Operate all tractors in a safe manner, on the track and in the pit- failure to be safe will result in a DQ
- Tractor must be registered before class begins
- Two hook limit per tractor plus an additional hook for the Powder Puff Class
- Each tractor is required to be registered under a single class category- if a tractor is caught jumping categories, they will be disqualified from both classes
- All pullers will be weighed before going to the staging area- we will allow 200 lb grace
- The Osceola FFA and Osceola FFA Alumni Tractor Pull Committee is responsible for the classes and rules- their decisions are final
- All drivers are encouraged to attend the drivers meeting

### **General Tractor Rules**

- No year limits on tractors
- Front wheel assist and/or dual wheels are allowed in any class
- 20 inch hitch height
- All classes are turbo/non-turbo combined unless specifically noted
- Pullers will keep hook points open and accessible- no cement blocks on the back allowed
- Hitch Must be 3 inch wide by 3.75 inch long minimum opening on hook point (see diagram)
- No use of clevis or hooking through a hammer strap allowed



### **Track Rules**

- No passengers/riders allowed
- No 1st puller re-hook
- Tractors must be in neutral/park while being hooked and unhooked
- All hooks will be made from a tight chain- NO JERKING THE SLED
- Pullers may be asked to exit and/or shut down the tractor if the track crew cannot hook/ unhook safely
- The track officials have the right to not allow a tractor to pull if it is deemed unsafe to hookup
- Pullers may stop at 100 ft and restart their pull once per hook
- Pay attention to the flagman! Green means go, red means stop- failure to comply may result in a DQ
- DO NOT TAKE THE SLED PAST THE GATE! The land on the other side of the fence is cemetery and village property and any damage will cause the FFA to pay to repair it- this will lead to a DQ and possibly not being allowed to pull the following year (full pull will be determined before the pull)
- If a part falls off the tractor during your hook, it will result in a DQ

# **Categories & Classes**

Out of the field: 3750, 4500, 5500\*, 6500, 7500, 8500, 9500 (Non-Turbo), 9500,

Powder Puff 9500 (Non-Turbo), 10500 (Non-Turbo), 11000, 13000\*, 15000\*,

15000 Farmington Feud, 18000\*, 21000\*, Unlimited

\* Class designated as a memorial class

- Must have a working PTO
- OEM appearing, or replacement fuel system (carburetor/injection pump)
- Aftermarket turbos allowed, but must be attached to OEM exhaust manifold and have OEM intake manifold
- No cut tires
- No aluminum replacement parts
- GM/Detroit 2-stroke diesel with only factory blower will be allowed in non-turbo class
- 15000 Farmington Feud is drive in only- must have stock injection pump and turbocharger
- No large articulating tractors in unlimited

# **Improved Farm:** 5000, 6000

- OEM engine, transmission and rear housing for that model
- Any cut tire is allowed

# **Altered Farm:** 11000, 12000

- 2.6 turbo, stock body injection pump
- Wheelie bars, air shut off, fuel dump required

#### Open Class: 12000

- Requisite safety equipment for the class it was made to run in- if it's a pro farm, it will have a cage, harness, wheelie bars, and air shutoff
